Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: You have heard Senator Ashford's closing. We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to your seats and record your presence. All those not in the Chamber, please come to the Chamber and record your presence. Senator Byars, Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Horgan, Senator Hartnett, Senator Lamb, Senator Lindsay, Senator Lynch, Senator Wesely. Senator Hartnett, would you please record your presence. Senator Schmit, would you please check in. We are now looking for Senator Lindsay. Senator Ashford, did you ask for a roll call? In regular order, okay. Senator Ashford, we are just missing Senator Lindsay. Can we proceed without him, or do we need to wait till he gets here? Okay. Senator Lindsay is here, you may proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK. (Roll call vote taken. See page 528 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 88 is advanced. We will now proceed to LB 69, but we cannot locate Senator Chambers so we'll pass over that for the moment. We will proceed to LB 137. Mr. Clerk. Yes, raise the call.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next bill for consideration, LB 137, introduced by Senators Moore, Rod Johnson and Coordsen. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10 of this year, was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Natural Resources Committee, Mr. President.
