agencies and testing water, NRD's, do you feel that there is any duplication in what they do?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: I hate to answer in absolute terms, but in my opinion, no, but there may be some of that going on that I'm not aware of. But basically, whereas if the groundwater conservation districts were not doing that, were not doing the well monitoring and the scheduling, the NRD's could do it. Now they have an agreement in this area, the NRD lets the groundwater conservation area do the bulk, if not all of that. So I hesitate to say, no, not any, but if it is, it's very little and as a whole, it is a working arrangement.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Hillman. Is there any further discussion on the bill? Seeing none, Senator Moore, do you wish to close?

SENATOR MOORE: Just ask for advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 5 nays on the vote to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 137 is advanced. We will now go back to LB 69, since we had passed over that, and Senator Chambers is here now. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 69 was a bill introduced by Senator Chambers. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10 of this year, referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Judiciary Committee. (Judiciary Committee amendments are printed on page 426 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Chambers, do you want to do the committee amendments?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I can tell you what the committee amendment is. First of all, this is a bill that would prohibit the university
