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to make rules and regulations affecting the governance of the university. I am not sure what the status of that old decision is in light of things that have happened recently, but just to extend my question a little further and relate it for you, it occurs to me that because of that decision, the possibility exists, because of that decision and because of some other framing of the language, that the possibility exists that we could...that one of these criminal provisions could be unconstitutional. And we have coming down another track in this Legislature a bill that says that any criminal provision that is unconstitutional in nature that we pass, it may end up that we end up paying for the cost of prosecution with regard to the defendant. So, in other words, in this instance, this is clearly a case to which that law would apply if there were an unconstitutional provision, I think you would agree. And so I guess I have a two-part question, in light of what we are trying to do, do you think that other bill is very wise to begin with, but, secondly and more importantly, for your purposes, do you feel comfortable assuring us that what you are doing is constitutional in light of the Exon decision and in light of some of the language, particularly in Section 5 where I have some doubts as to whether we can really constitutionally prosecute under that section?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Beutler, your concern is with the felony provisions?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, suppose the felony provisions were not there and we simply leave everything in the area of enforcement to the individual or the school which is aggrieved, and it no longer has any criminal sanctions whatsoever. If the university feels it is about to suffer an irreparable harm, by going into equity, that is why it says, at law, equity, or appropriate remedy, they could seek an injunction. If a penalty was somehow imposed anyway and the university had not sought an injunction,...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...then they would seek damages and the measure of damages is put in as I explained it, here is what I am asking you. Would you feel more comfortable if the felony provisions were stripped, those relating to the university as
