SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Mr. President, colleagues, this is a resolution that I've brought in for a number of years on behalf of a constituent that is involved in restoring older cars, antique cars. These are the types of automobiles, and members that are a part of this organization, that show up at the different parades throughout the state.
