SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Chambers, I don't know as much about this as you do, I will admit that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you offered this amendment. Do you know that the university keeps the remainder of the Pell grant that the player cannot receive?

SENATOR HEFNER: I figured they did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you aware that this affects the college work study program, that the athletes that I am talking about cannot participate in that program, are you aware of that?

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Chambers, what I am concerned about is that...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I want to know if you are aware of it.

SENATOR HEFNER: ...this bill, if we pass this bill, then the NCAA could issue some sanctions against us.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, well, let's...if you will answer the questions, or if you refuse to answer the questions, just tell me and I won't ask you any more. Are you aware that it involves the Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants, the SEOGs? Are you aware that it involves those?

SENATOR HEFNER: I don't know about that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The SSIG program, are you aware that it involves that program?

SENATOR HEFNER: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How about the Scholarship Assistance Program?

SENATOR HEFNER: I don't know about that one either.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The State Scholarship Award Program.
