SENATOR BEUTLER: I would just remind the body that the enforcement provisions are still there. There are civil enforcement provisions in Section 11, and in Section 5, the Attorney General has...the Attorney General has the power to take whatever action is necessary to enforce the directive, which bothers me a little bit, Senator Chambers, with our aggressive Attorney General, he may launch a couple of Scuds toward the Central Administration Office. That is my closing, Mr. Speaker.
