

SENATOR MOORE: Okay...

SENATOR WESELY: ...you know, we're going to look at it but we don't want to be shackled down if we don't see any need...

SENATOR MOORE: Okay, I would be interested in Senator Coordsen's opinion on the Wesely amendment but while I have the microphone I...after listening to Senator...I think somewhere, I think Senator Wesely's...if you adopt Senator Wesely's amendment you'd make Senator Landis's speech even more accurate because then...everything you can do already. I guess the one thing, the bill as it now stands does require the committee to do something where now they don't and certainly it can be argued if the committee don't want to do it, why make them do it. I guess one of the concerns that I have and where I differ with Senator Landis is the need for the Legislature to do something, some way to track that. I think many members of this body will remember the whole controversy over the bioptic lens problem we had a couple years ago. And that was a rule and reg where I believe Motor Vehicles had done something and actually made it so that many people that had been driving could not drive by rule and reg. Most of us did not know about it until later and then eventually we had a bill that, after a great deal of debate, caused more of a problem. And so I think there's a need for us to follow that. And I know Senator Robak, that was her bill, she had to eventually have a bill to correct that problem, created by a rule and reg. I do not know if this bill had been in effect if things would have been any different. But there's certainly things that are done on the administrative level and bureaucratic level that, obviously, you can argue with the executive branch and legislative branch that certainly impact us and we need to know what's going on. I think any way to make those things more accessible and make them more mandatory that we find out what's going on would be good. One of the concerns that I have and now I will turn to Senator Coordsen and ask a question. Now you mentioned in your opening on your bill itself that there was...there has been past Supreme Court problems in this particular type of...Senator Coordsen. Would Senator Coordsen yield to a question?
