

be concerned about how this would really, in the future, change how we look at legislative histories and legislative intent? And it's just a concern that if somebody could look at it, I would appreciate it.

SPEAKER BAACK: Time. Further discussion on the Wesely amendment? Senator Wesely, your light's on, do you want to discuss it right now? Okay, Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler waives off. Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The Wesely amendment actually brings Section 3 into alignment with the amended Section 2. Section 2, the amendment added a new sentence, "the Standing Committee may request a draft copy of the rule or regulation or any portion thereof." Senator Wesely's amendment, changing the "shall" in line 10 to "may", gives them then a little bit more flexibility. If they get the draft copy, I would make an assumption that they would review it if they have made the effort to go ahead and investigate the matter more in depth. But it does not change the Section 3 because if they do decide to review, then the steps are still spelled out as "shall" in there. So the Wesely amendment, I think, is in line with the amended version of the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. We will now proceed to Senator Landis. Did you wish to speak on the Wesely...Senator Landis waives off. Senator Haberman, did you want to talk on the Wesely...no, he waives off. Okay, Senator Wesely, did you wish to close on your amendment? Senator Wesely waives closing. So we will now proceed to a vote on the Wesely amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Now we will proceed to discussion on the bill as amended. Senator Landis. Senator Landis waives off. Senator Haberman, on the bill.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, approximately six years ago this type of legislation was presented to the Legislature that called for the Legislature's committee and committee chairman to review the rules and regulations. At that time, this body saw fit to pass that
