SENATOR COORDSEN: Yeah.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, I won't take up more time here but I may want to look at that closer...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...to see if there is something that I think is not as clear as perhaps it should be. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Seeing no one else wishing to debate the issue, do you have a closing statement, Senator Coordsen?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Move 259.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We will now proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 259. All in favor please vote aye, opposed please vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 259.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is approved and LB 259 is advanced. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 117 introduced by Senators Schimek and Crosby. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10, referred to the Government Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Government Committee.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I will now recognize Senator Conway for the amendments from the committee.

CLERK: It's the emergency clause, Senator.

SENATOR CONWAY: Be right with you. The committee amendment is to put on an E clause, is all that the committee amendment consists of. The bill is adding an additional person onto the county service system and the idea of the E clause is to try to have it on board so that it can be engaged in the following
