And if somebody looks closely, if he's not with me and we use it, we ought to go to jail. Now we also changed the handicapped parking law and you folks supported it, and I introduced the legislation and I appreciated it, that gives law enforcement agencies a chance to go on private property and, in fact, arrest...or tow cars that are parked illegally in handicapped parking. All too often, it puts the merchant and others at a disadvantage when people violate the law and others complain because they could do nothing about it. But we can do something about that now. So, Jim, the only concern I had was the use of the word "agent" and how it could maybe offer more opportunities to people to violate, as I have demonstrated are violating, the privilege of using handicapped parking and, for that reason, I have to admit...and I should have been at the hearing and I apologize, I couldn't because of a conflict, show a concern over the language and the use of the word "agent".

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lynch. I now recognize Senator Dierks, followed by Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Madam President, and members of the body, I appreciate Senator Lynch's concerns. I have those same concerns but I also have the feeling that most people that Senator Cudaback is going to be dealing with on this issue are honest and forthright and don't intend to abuse that privilege. And I have had the same calls from constituents of mine who wish that they could have this privilege and so I'm going to support this legislation. I think it's...I think it's important for most of the honest folks that will use it in an honest way. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Madam President and members of the body, Senator Lynch, I do...I had the same feelings about your "agent" concern but I guess you could relate it to it's pretty hard to have a rodeo without having the livestock.
