SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members, this bill was brought to me over a year ago by a young lawyer in Arapahoe, who has as a hobby making some alcoholic beverage wine in his basement, and in looking at the statutes to discover what he could and couldn't do legally, he discovered that the statutes say that he cannot put his homemade wine for his own use in a used container. Of course, this has not been enforced but he thought he'd like to be legal. This merely allows an individual who is, for a hobby, making his own wine to put it in a used wine bottle and still be legal for his own private use. And I'd ask the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any discussion? Seeing none, Senator Elmer, do you wish to close? He waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 124. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 124.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 124 is advanced. Before we proceed to the next bill I might ask the members to please try to be in the Chamber so we can continue to do business. We're able to move through some bills here fairly rapidly. If we get people here, we can move through them even more rapidly, so please try and stay close to the Chamber. LB 202, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 202 was a bill introduced by Senators Smith, Rod Johnson, Will, Rogers and Rasmussen. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 11, referred to General Affairs, advanced to General File. I have no amendments at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, LB 202 seeks to increase the state registration fee paid by all license applicants by \$5.00. The \$5.00 increase will be credited to the Nebraska Liquor Commission Rule and Regulation Cash Fund and it will be used for the purpose of providing all licensees with the following materials: First of all, the commission's law book which does include the Nebraska Liquor Control Act and the commission's rules and regulations, the commission's newsletter which is distributed quarterly, the
