So actually, when you take into consideration that plus the \$4.00 for redistribution, they are paying the \$5.00 increase in their license, this is a lot cheaper and what they are doing is covering so that everyone gets it. Now it's only those that make the request that are updated.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, and did they not update changes in law in their newsletter previously?

SENATOR SMITH: In their what, their newsletter?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: In their newsletter.

SENATOR SMITH: But, see, now it's up to the person whether or not they want to take the newsletter and so they only have like a quarter of their licensees that are even getting the newsletter. So we have like 75 percent of them that are uninformed about all the changes.

SENATOR SMITH: Yes, but now what this would do is that they would all get the newsletter, they would all get the law book, all the up dates for the \$5.00 increase.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, they get a new law book every year then?

SENATOR SMITH: They get the updated version.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay. And if they lose it and they want another one, they got to give 15, pay 15 for it.

SENATOR SMITH: I don't know. That was not addressed in the bill.
