SENATOR WESELY: So it's particular....

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Right now there is some people driving illegally, really, because they...if they don't get an extension, it's real hard to get it done in just 15 days.

SENATOR WESELY: The only...I guess I can certainly understand having financial difficulty in trying to come up with the resources to purchase a car and having some accommodation made. The only question I had was, do you see any problem with in transit proliferation and causing any problems for law enforcement of people abusing in transit?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I don't think there would be, Senator, because right now there are some people going past a day or two in order to get the license, but I don't think there would be any full scale trying to do that. I don't see that happening.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay. All I was thinking was that by giving them more time there will be more people with in transit and more people trying to use that to get by and...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: We're trying to give them more time, Senator, that because if you...the sales tax now for a vehicle is getting to be a tremendous expense for a lot of people and this will give them also an extra paycheck so it will give them a little bit longer time to pay that sales tax.
