and we felt that by going once every three years but auditing the last 36 months, which would be the three years, was cheaper than going the other route and so that is what the purpose of this bill is. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there discussion? Seeing none, Senator Smith, do you wish to close? She waives closing so we will now proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 119. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 119.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 119 is advanced. We'll now proceed to LB 171.

CLERK: LB 171, Mr. President, introduced by the Transportation Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 11, referred to the Transportation Committee, was advanced to General File. I have committee amendments pending.

SPEAKER BAACK: The Chairman of the Transportation Committee, Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator Baack. LB 171, just to give you a brief overview of what we are changing, this is a bill that would require that before a car dealer can renew their dealer license they have to show that they have liability coverage to do that. And so it is a restriction that they are placing upon themselves to make sure that everybody who deals and has a motor vehicle dealer's license has insurance and, thus, it stops some of the fly-by-night people. The committee amendments are clarifying amendments. What they do is to make sure that instead of listing out each car that they have in their inventory, because from time to time that may be very difficult in naming each specific car, they have to show that they have insurance coverage that covers the fleet of motor vehicles owned by them during their ordinary course of business. So this doesn't require them to name each vehicle. It just requires, it clarifies that it covers all vehicles that they have in their inventory at that time. The second one is in relationship to worker's compensation. There is currently statutes in law that require worker's compensation coverage for employees. This bill talks about that you have to be covered by
