SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Rod Johnson's closing. We will now vote on the advancement of LB 142. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Rod Johnson, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: I would like to ask for a call of the house, please, and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for the house to go under call. All those in favor of going under call vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. Will all members please report to the Chamber and be seated and check in, please. The house is under call. All members please return to the Chamber. Senator Bernard-Stevens, please check in. Senator Conway, please check in. We're looking for Senators Beutler and Lindsay, Senator Wesely and Pirsch...and Senator Pirsch. We're looking for Senators Pirsch and Lindsay. The house is under call. We're looking for Senator Lindsay. Please come to the Chamber, Senator Lindsay, we are under call. Senator Johnson has called for a roll call vote and he said that we should go ahead and proceed. Proceed with the roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator...Mr. Speaker...

SPEAKER BAACK: Proceed, Mr. Clerk, yes, regular order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 583-84 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 142 is advanced. The call is raised. We will now proceed to LB 247. Mr. Clerk.
