CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have ceased debate. We will proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 22. Senator Coordsen, do you wish to close first?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Madam President. While we've spent so much time on this bill, probably wouldn't hurt if I took just about 30 more seconds. By golly, I am enthused. Senator Landis, I think maybe we ought to get the little four-foot piece of hedge post out and beat those agencies into submission. But I think what I'll do, before we do that, is give them a little opportunity, a small window pane, so to speak, of correcting the errors in their ways and following the bright light to pure righteousness. And we'll allow this bill to remain permissive as far as the committees are concerned. And, if that doesn't work, then certainly we will have ample opportunity to perhaps follow some of Senator Haberman's suggestions. But let's try it this way first and advance the bill in its current form as amended. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. We will now proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 22. All those in favor please vote aye, all those opposed please vote nay. Senator Coordsen. Request for a record vote.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Right.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We are still under call. Have you all recorded your votes? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 602-03 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 18 nays, Madam President, on the motion to advance.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion to advance fails on LB 22. Mr. Clerk. Do we have some items for the record?

CLERK: I do, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I will raise the call.

CLERK: I have notice of hearing from the General Affairs Committee, signed by Senator Smith as Chair of the committee.
