PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Members of the body, here in the past few weeks Senator Morrissey has been involved in playing pitch and sometimes we play by Senator Schellpeper's rules which are called Stanton rules. So I would like to inform this body and Senator Morrissey that, after you're 40 years old, your pitch should improve and I'm looking forward to that. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Haberman. We'll proceed to number five on the agenda on General File. I will...before we get to that agenda item, I will recognize Senator Conway for a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Madam President and members, just a short time ago the Pages passed out to you a memo from myself on behalf of the Government Committee. In fact, there was two units out and really why I am drawing it to your attention, you can read what is in those, but they look so much alike I want you to recognize the fact that they are two separate instruments. The one that is thicker was written first describing some of the process relative to the redistricting and some of the information that is in there that I think many of you will find important, but the following page which is a single two-pager that looks like the other one in terms of the cover letter is different and what it describes is a qualification that in the larger one talked about the data not being available and would not be available probably until March and maybe even as late as April. We were notified late last night after the first memo was all prepared that at early this morning, sometime today, we are to receive the final census data from Washington on the magnetic tapes and the second one describes that, so I wanted to draw your attention to the fact that there are two separate ones and you didn't get duplications, but you do need to look at both of those. There is some real important information I think most of you will find very interesting.
