SENATOR WITHEM: Yeah, that is true. The people would still be...the proponents would be the LaVista city administrator and I believe the League of Municipalities is supportive. Hastings, Grand Island and Norfolk would not be impacted.

SENATOR LAMB: So the bill, as it stands now, would only affect three counties in the state. Is that correct?

SENATOR WITHEM: That is correct.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lamb. I will now recognize Senator Pirsch, followed by Senators Robak and Warner. Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Madam President. I also have some questions about this bill and, in fact, I had had a call on it from one of those who have a development there. Senator Withem, would you yield again?

SENATOR WITHEM: Certainly would.

SENATOR PIRSCH: First of all, you talked about the city providing services. What services does the city have to provide outside their city limits?

SENATOR WITHEM: In the zoning jurisdiction, they deal with a number of services, police, fire sorts of protection, enforcement of codes, building inspections.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Do they not contract with them for fire, employees? They don't provide them as a matter of force (interruption).

SENATOR WITHEM: It was my understanding that they do. I might be wrong on that. People that are more familiar with...and I see Senator Hartnett is not here, and Senator Lynch, maybe they're more knowledgeable in specifically what services are provided.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you. I guess I have a real question about that. And one of the points that was brought up to me was that the original intent, of course, of these kinds of tracts
