fight that bill when that bill comes in. This, at this point, having been amended is not that bill at this point, it's a fairly innocuous provision and I would urge you to support it.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Withem. We will now proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 76. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the motion to advance LB 76? We did have a request for a record vote. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 614 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 3 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 76.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted and LB 76 is advanced to E & R. We do have some special visitors in the Chambers today. Seated in the south balcony are 45 state officers of the Future Farmers of America Association. They are celebrating Nebraska Vocational Education Week. Welcome. CLERK. Madam President, the next bill is LB 68 introduced by Senator Chambers. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10 of this year, referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Government Committee.

SENATOR CONWAY: Madam President and members, the Government Committee, upon review of LB 68, offers an amendment that is found on page 5, line 11. When the discussion was involved with respect to when does this become an enactment and kick into being and the whole discussion was following relative to after four other states were involved. Well, since the states are not members of the Big 8 Conference, the institutions themselves are, the Government Committee decided that it would be more appropriate to follow with an amendment that would describe that when similar legislation is enacted by states in which four Big 8 schools are located would be a proper trigger rather than to discuss the fact that when four additional states which are members of the Big 8, some states are not members.
