SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Hefner, there was a hypocritical sect, at the time that Jesus lived, and he said, they bind heavy burdens, grievous to be borne, and laid them on other men's shoulders, yet they will not touch one of them with their little finger. That's the NCAA. It puts those heavy rules, grievous to be borne, on all these young players, and will not comply, in their own conduct, with the least of them. They make tons of money off these players. They get very large, no interest and low interest loans from the money generated by these players. The bill is eminently fair, eminently just, it allows a conscience vote, it notifies the NCAA that changes must occur, and it encourages other states to join in, because the players are residents of this state and we have as much obligation to look to their interests as we do to any student attending school.
