SPEAKER BAACK: I am going to have to rule that any further discussion is not in order because we have nothing in front of us at this present time. We have nothing...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I think it is because of what you said to Senator Withem, I think you...all right, if it comes up, we might take a long time then, but I am definitely going to make the point because there is no certainty that that bill will ever be advanced, so if you accept that motion, you have, in effect, killed 88. He is including in his motion the idea that the bill will stay here until an event which may never happen is the point. So I would challenge it when it comes up if that is the form in which it is offered.

SPEAKER BAACK: I agree with you, Senator Chambers. I was only making a ruling on the basis that that motion was not a priority motion, and he can put the motion up here, but then we can have the discussion on what that motion entails later. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I apologize. I stand chastised.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have a priority motion. Senator Hefner would move to bracket LB 88 until February 27, 1991.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I offer this motion for the same reason that I offered the other motion, and this would bracket LB 88 until February 27th. This will give us a little more time to get LB 262 before us, debate it on General File, and either advance it or not advance it to Select File. I apologize for offering a motion that was not in order, and I believe that this bracket motion should be in order. Thank you.
