CLEKK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the confirmation report.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The confirmation report is adopted and Mr. Verne Moore is confirmed to the Commission on Industrial Relations. We will now proceed with item 6 on the agenda, Final Reading.
