PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 117 as amended to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: All those in favor of the motion to advance LB 117 please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 117 is advanced. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator, LB 113, first of all I have E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 113.

PRESIDENT MOUL: All those in favor of the motion to adopt the E & R amendments please say aye. Opposed nay. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, I do have other amendments to the bill. The first amendments I have are from Senator Lynch. Senator, I have a note on this particular amendment that you want to withdraw it. I have a second amendment from you, AM0286, is that correct, Senator?

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes. Madam President and members, I would like permission from the Legislature to withdraw amendment, AM0250. The language that was provided in this amendment was recommended for change by the bill drafters, and it is as simple as it is. The intent stays the same but the language would be clearer based on their recommendation. So I would move that this would be...that I'd be permitted to withdraw this and I would like to substitute it for another amendment properly written.

PRESIDENT MOUL: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: I now have AM0286. (See pages 684-86 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR LYNCH: Excuse me, Madam Chairman, I am looking for the amendment now. If you will look on the white copy of the bill, on line 5, on page 3, the language is changed to read "is not being transported". By using the word "transported" it more
