frankly, the difference in four days is not going to make the difference in most cases as to whether they can turn around and have that property put back into productive use. And so I have no problem with the 14 days as opposed to 10. Senator Beutler's concerns on page 2 are reasonable concerns. We have also had some discussions about some of the policies in the bill. At this point in time, though, I believe these are amendments that would make the bill better, I consent to them, and I would also urge their adoption. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Does anyone else wish to debate the amendment? Seeing none, do you have a closing statement, Senator Schimek? Closing is waived. We will proceed to vote on the Schimek amendment to LB 36. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Schimek's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator Will.
