There are people who said they were against this war until it started. Then once it started they said, I've got to be for it. That's like me saying a woman being assaulted, there's an attempt to assault her and I say I'm against the assault, I'm against the assault, then somebody completes the assault and I say, well, now that it's started I've got to go along with it. Not me. It was wrong before it started, it's wrong now and if this country is going to stop somebody, why don't they run off into Russia and help the people in Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania? Because Russia is a white country but more than that Russia is a big country, Russia is a strong country and this country is not going to touch a big country. Why don't they run off into China where some of these so-called fighters for democracy have been imprisoned? Why don't they run off into South Africa? Because America picks and chooses and is going to pick those who are weak, those are different from what they are, and make their move. We all know this and if some of you don't, I'm here to tell you about it. I said, the first part of the session, about this war that America is far from its source of supply, and after they make their initial blastings with bombs and ammunition they're going to have a problem of supply, and yesterday I read in the paper that the American troops are running short on ammunition. That makes me a communist or something, doesn't it, because I predicted it and it happened so I'm the cause of its happening. Not so. Senator Conway, I spent some time in the military too and I got an honorable discharge. I wasn't thrown out. I didn't kill anybody either, so I'm not a hero. But a political decision is going to be made pretty soon as to whether or not to send these young people into the teeth of death, on the ground, because Bush is losing support from people here, not a military decision but a political decision. They will be blown up with mines. They will be shot and cut to ribbons by people who are dug in positions, and I'm supposed to go along with that and say it's all right? Never. When you talk about war crimes, the winner is the one in the position to determine who the criminal is. Had the Nazi's won, there are Americans who would have been war
