Then further down he leaves Article I, Section 22 in it, and he leaves Article IV of the Constitution, Section 6 in the minority report, but then he strikes the next paragraph of Section A. Also he strikes all of Section B and all of Section C, but he does leave in there that as a result the vote totals for each of the candidates for the 30th Legislative District shall remain as reported and approved by the State Board of Canvassers. Also he leaves number 3 in, that Dennis Byars be declared the duly elected senator for the 30th Legislative District and as such that he be seated as a member of the 92nd Legislature. Now Senator Warner has come up with another proposed motion or an amendment and as I understand it, I believe I could support that. I don't have a copy on my desk yet but, Senator Warner, could I ask you a question?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Warner. Senator Warner, would you respond to a question, please?

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Warner, my question to you is, do you strike all of the minority report as it is written now?
