Other than that, with the arguments having been made, in my opinion the issue withdrawn, I think it's appropriate to resolve the issue and vote on the permanent seating.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Warner. On the speaking list, Senator Hall, you're up.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, members of the body, I rise, but I just don't know how to vote on this. The 30th legislative district should have a permanent seating, that needs to be done. This is different than the election contest, and that's something I had to realize between getting out of my seat and reaching the microphone. For that purpose, I'm going to support the seating of Senator Byars. That in no way, shape or form reflects what took place yesterday and the vote by this body. That's what we have to remember, that's what my vote reflects when I vote green on this, because the two are separate and distinct. There's a clear difference between ignoring the statutes and seating the 30th legislative district permanently, and that's why I'm going to vote green.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Chambers, your light is on.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, it's interesting how after you've been a part of a system, of a Legislature for two decades that by degrees and without even becoming aware of it conscientiously you develop, in some situations, an institutionalized way of thinking, where you become concerned about that institution itself, even though on occasion I have probably lambasted the Legislature as an institution. The Legislature collectively talking about the members, individual legislators, more than anybody else has. But sometimes there is like that light that goes on in the brain, that leap in the brain where suddenly there is a peculiar clarity with which you view the thing that on occasion you've expressed so much contempt for. And you see the power that it actually has to do good. The purposes for which it was created in an idealistic mind. And that it has sufficient value because of its potential to justify trying to maintain its integrity, so that the system itself is not stained or crippled by actions which are done in haste or because people are tired.
