CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 756-57 of the Legislative Journal.) 42 ayes, 4 nays, 1 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 404 with the emergency clause passes. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business I propose to sign do sign LB 404E. (See page 757 of the Legislative Journal.) Mr. Clerk, to General File. Oh, Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Thank you, Mr. President. Your Committee on Banking, Commerce and Insurance whose Chair is Senator Landis reports LB 159 to General File, LB 160, LB 161 and LB 162 all to General File, those signed by Senator Landis. (See page 757 of the Legislative Journal.)

Notice of hearing from the Government Committee, Health and Human Services Committee, Banking Committee, all signed by their respective Chairs. That's all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We'll now proceed to General File. LB 237.

CLERK: Mr. President, 237 was a bill introduced by Senators Landis, Lindsay, Schmit, Haberman, Abboud, Wesely, Conway. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 14 of this year, at that time referred to the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have Banking Committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: To the Chair of the Banking Committee, Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, about a week ago, maybe 10 days, we had a rather boring day on General File in which I described for you in detail four major pieces of legislation on insurance regulation. I told you then about the move to certify states in their ability to regulate insurance companies for financial solvency, that the National Association of Insurance Commissioners has begun a program that Nebraska is poised on the edge of being
