it flows out for this biennium and the next biennium followed by our preliminary recommendation compared with the Governor's recommendation on the next two pages. Then the committee recommendation compared to a current appropriation. Then it is followed by a narrative, not a narrative, but some figures on state aid and then followed and lastly by some significant increases by agency is a listing of it. For those, the committee in its preliminary report has proposed a spending total of \$1,478,000,000 for this, for '91-92; \$1,549,000,000 for fiscal year '92-93. In our present status we are showing in that budget a 3.76 reserve at the biennium. The one other note that the people will be interested in is that in our preliminary recommendation request, state agencies and only state agencies, we request of them, mandate upon them a 4 percent across-the-board cut in our General Fund operations, a 4 percent across-the-board cut, General Fund operations. If there are any questions of myself, the fiscal staff or any member of the Appropriations Committee, we will do what we can to help you understand this and I encourage you to look over it. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Yes, Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: I just wanted to note that the rule says 20-30 days after the Governor's speech and in our efficiency we are even before 20 legislative days have expired, so we got it in ahead of schedule actually.
