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television, which would be very devastating to our football program, or they could say, no, you're not eligible for a bowl game, and it could go on and on. Our former coach, Bob Devaney, now Athletic Director, and our coach, Tom Osborne, I feel has brought us a lot of national recognition. They've put Nebraska on the map. They've done a terrific job. They've probably done more to put Nebraska on the map than any other thing that I know of. It's been a form of economic development for us. What I'm trying to say here is we've got something going for us, and I don't think we ought to be meddling in trying to change that. Let's don't destroy it. Somebody said, well, we did have three losses last season, but that isn't a bad record. When I went to high school, and I hate to tell you how long ago that's been, but when I went to high school our coach told us if you won more games than you lost, you had a successful season. But it seems like now the pressure is to win all of them, you've got to win all your games or you're not successful. I feel that passage of this bill will provide a perfect tool for recruiters from other schools to use against Nebraska, because they say, well, Nebraska is going to be sanctioned in a year or two. And so it could be hard on our recruiting. And I believe by trying to help, like Senator Chambers is doing, trying to help a few players, we could hurt many other players on the team. And this could run into hundreds. I feel that this bill is unfair to our coaches who work so hard to train our athletes and to win our games. And, by the way, folks, our players here in Nebraska learn a lot more than just football, and our coaches work very hard to abide by the NCAA rules. If this bill passes, the university will have to abide by our laws, which will put them out of compliance with the NCAA rules. Let's not tamper with the university's football program, because I feel it could be very devastating. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hefner. I'll now recognize Senator Chambers, followed by Senators Chizek, Haberman, Ashford and Schmit. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam Chair and members of the Legislature, the only problem with Senator Haberman's...I mean Senator Hefner's discussion is that he said nothing about what the bill does. For those who are interested, this is not a bill that pays players, first of all. Secondly, it does not prevent the NCAA from doing anything, Senator Hefner. This is not a bill that protects the university from the NCAA, so whoever wrote that statement for you was thinking about another bill. This
