Senator Landis. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Yes, I'd like to request a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion has been made to place the house under call. We will have a machine vote. All those in favor please vote yes, opposed no. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All members who are not excused please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Please check in. Looking for Senators Robinson and Rogers. Senator Elmer. Senator Lamb and Senator Rod Johnson. Senator Schmit, Senator Robinson and Senator Wickersham. We're looking for Senator Schmit. Senator Conway, we do have Senator Schmit on his way. Do you wish to proceed? We'll proceed with the roll call vote.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 802-03 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 23 nays.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The Landis amendment to the amendment fails. We now proceed with the committee amendments. I will raise the call and do you have an amendment on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Smith would then move to amend the committee amendments. (Smith amendment appears on page 803 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Madam Chairman, members of the body. First of all, I have a comment for Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, I'm glad to see you have your royal blue sweatshirt on today. That's a little joke we have between us. What I would like to do now is offer the amendment that I proposed the other day and what it simply does is on page 2, Section 4, line 24, it changes the word "shall" to "may". It doesn't designate any special group to the exclusion of others. It doesn't designate which flags are okay, which are not. What it does do, it just makes a statement of concern for all POW, missing in action folks as a result of military service on behalf of their country
