And they won't do it, but maybe there's one or two cities out there that will, that says, hey, look at the big crunch you're putting us in under the terms of this bill. You are saying to us, we close it or we haul it wherever, nobody knows. You know, it's putting the burden on that city where it belongs in this case if that's the way it has to be. It's not on the state. What's wrong with that? What's wrong with that? If DEC says, yes, you can go ahead and operate without being licensed, what's wrong with that? DEC is in control, still and all, and the burden is put on the city or village to bring evidence to DEC that they're not polluting. Nothing wrong with it. I hope you adopt the amendment.
