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and...or I should say cart before the horse, or the horse before...I guess we don't have too many horses left anymore. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hefner. I will now recognize Senator Hartnett, followed by Senator Crosby, Morrissey, Schmit and Beutler. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I would like to call the question if that's appropriate.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Do we have any seconds? Seeing sufficient seconds, the issue is shall debate cease? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We will cease debate and I now call on Senator Johnson for closing.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: After almost two days of discussing this, we've finally come back to the committee amendments with one minor change. As I said before, the committee amendments require second class cities and villages to prepare a plan by December 15, 1993. That plan should include either requirements for licensing of the facility that they're operating or closure of their landfill. And the plans shall be approved by the department and be addressed to the threat of air, water and land pollution. And also the committee amendment adopts standards or the council, DEC Council shall adopt standards by July 1 of '92, relating to standards for closure and postclosure of landfills in Nebraska, both licensed and unlicensed facilities. The one amendment that was adopted is the amendment by Senator Morrissey that adds language to include that the DEC Council shall also find a date to bring landfills into compliance of either closure or licensing. I guess at this particular point that's the committee amendments. There's a lot of disagreement as to whether the committee amendments do anything, whether we abdicate our responsibility to DEC to do this. I am of the attitude I still would like to see this bill move today and work out whatever technical problems we have with the bill in the meantime between General and Select File. And I would, at this point, on behalf of the committee move the committee amendments as amended.
