They have a difficult time getting out many times and mowing weeds particularly where you find more of these problems is in the alleyways where it's difficult to get out. I have a difficult time, people that are gone for vacation for a couple weeks, they get a notice filed on their doorstep or someplace, within five days they have to respond; they don't even come home for two weeks and all of a sudden it's been done and a lien is put on their home. I get very frustrated at the fact that the cities are very indiscriminate about who they do this to and for what reason they do it to. I assume that Falls City or North Platte or wherever has a particular law in a particular area that they are having a tough time with so they want something like this so they can really crack down. The point is that even if the city does this, if I don't sell my property, if there is a lien filed and I don't sell my property, they're not going to get anything for a long, long time. And if I refuse to pay the only other option they have is to go to court and they're going to spend a heck of a lot more money going to court than they would if they simply did not receive the \$100 fine. So I don't see this as real good policy. I don't see this as being very helpful to communities. I don't see this being helpful to people who have difficult times getting out. I see the cities as trying to take a sledge hammer on certain people, have certain bits of legislations to help it on certain situations when, in fact, good clean cities, how our cities look is something a community needs to take pride in, something the community needs to deal with and quite honestly, something the community can handle without going to state legislation at this time. I'd hope the bill would not advance. Thank you.
