PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR WITHEM: ...you come up with the ideas and the best ideas will be ones that we will fund. And you're not going to see...gosh, if I weren't such a partisan Democrat, I'd talk about thousand points of light out there or 10,000 points of light out there and that's kind of what we're doing with this kind of bill. We're looking at that expertise of our dedicated teachers, our dedicated school board people, our dedicated administrators, our dedicated parents who probably know better how to accomplish these tasks than we do here at the state level. We need to hold school districts accountable for their results, accountable for their outcomes, but give them the incentives to come up with better ways to reach those outcomes. Again, it's a good bill and I compliment Senator Rasmussen for bringing it to us and urge you to support the motion.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Withem. The speaking order now is Senator Dierks, Moore, Schmit, Hefner, Hall, Warner and Nelson. The question is, shall debate cease? Do we have sufficient seconds? Yes, we do. We will proceed to vote on the motion to call the question. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the motion to cease debate? Senator Dierks.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion has been made to place the house under call. We will have a machine vote. All those in favor please vote yes, opposed no. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All members who are not excused please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Please check in. Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Accept call in votes, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: And call in votes are being accepted, Mr. Clerk.
