All of those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 237 advances. Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk? Okay, we will continue with Select File, then. Before we do that, I want to make a couple of introductions. A guest today of Senator Bernard-Stevens and Senator Withem is seated under the north balcony. He is Tom Berve of Papillion, Nebraska. Please stand and be recognized, and welcome. Also seated under the south balcony as a guest of Senator Robak is Judge John Whitehead from Columbus. Judge Whitehead, welcome. Select File, LB 114A.

CLERK: LB 114A, Senator, I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Schimek. Senator Will, I am sorry. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Madam President. I just want to take a minute of your time, I just wanted to note that this is not Senator Schmit's bill. Senator Wesely afterwards, I will tell you about that commission, there really is such a commission. It really was Highway and Bridges, Highways and Bridges. Thank you.
