SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I will waive closing.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Closing is waived. We will proceed to vote on the Wickersham amendment to LB 455. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please, record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Is there anyone who wishes to speak on the motion to advance LB 455? Seeing none, do you have a closing, Senator Schellpeper?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, Madam Chair, I would move that we move this bill. I just want to again emphasize that this is something that will help rural Nebraska nursing homes and also that we have to have 30 votes because Senator Wickersham put the E clause on, so we will need 30 votes. Thank you.
