LB 420, 420A, 488

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Seeing no one wishing to debate the issue, we will proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 420. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to advance 420.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 420 is advanced. LB 420A.

CLERK: LB 420A, by Senator Kristensen. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President. If you will look in your bill books, the implementation cost of LB 420 is \$10,000. It is a one-time cost to make the state computer system be able to talk to the county computers and allow for this transfer to occur. This is a one-time cost only and it will...there is a corresponding savings in the Department of Motor Vehicles for entry costs under this bill. Those costs have not been reflected in this fiscal note as to savings but the fiscal note does reflect those savings in there. This is a very small one-time cost just to bring the computer system up. And if we're going to make use of our \$8 million investment, this is a small implementation cost. With that, I would ask for its adoption.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Seeing no one wishing to debate, we will proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 420A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 420A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 420A is advanced. LB 488.

CLERK: LB 488 was a bill introduced by Senator Withem. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 22, referred to Education, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.
