LB 356, 356A, 357

under LB 356 through the efforts...between the industry and the Department of Agriculture. Briefly, the bill intends to define and redefine terms, collects titles, clarifies the duties of the department and those who buy or sell by weight, measure, account are performed uniformly by adopting the current standards published by the department, the National Institute of Standard Technology. The bill is intended to improve enforcement of the act by requiring a permit of those who operate commercial weighing and measuring devices. With that, Madam Speaker, I ask that the bill be advanced.

CLERK: LB 356A introduced by Senator Rogers. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Rogers.

SENATOR ROGERS: Madam Speaker, the department will receive additional funds in '92-93 due to the assessment of the one-time operator fee of \$5 and the A bill will just strictly...or allow the department to extend the additional fee revenues they received in the weights and measures Cash Fund. There is no General Funds involved. I ask for its advancement.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Rogers. Seeing no one wishing to debate, we will proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 356A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 356A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 356A advances. LB 357.

CLERK: LB 357, Madam President, introduced by the Agriculture Committee. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 16, referred to Agriculture, advanced to General File.
