

that permits all the members of the board to hear all the other members at the meeting and that that would qualify as legally permissible. It is possible, should a corporation wish to do so, to simply eschew this power by saying in their bylaws, we will have our meetings done in person or in their articles of incorporation we will have our meetings done in person, but to the extent that they have not created that bar to themselves, this statute would permit them to have these kinds of meetings, something which we already allow for profit mutual insurance companies to do as of last year. I move for the advancement of the measure.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Landis. Seeing no one wishing to debate the motion, we will proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 250. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the advancement of the bill, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 250 is advanced. LB 341.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 341 was introduced by the Natural Resources Committee. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 16 of this year. It was referred to the Natural Resources Committee and they report the bill to General File.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Morrissey, could you present this bill?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Maybe, Madam Chair. I wasn't prepared to, but as the Clerk mentioned, 341 prohibits possession of certain protected game, if the game or fish is shipped in from outside of this state or acquired from licensed game farms or licenses fish farms. We have some farms that are growing, breeding, selling ostriches and other exotic species within the state and this, LB 341 would allow those farmers and others to prohibit those...to possess those game animals if, indeed, they were brought in from out of state.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. Is there anyone who wishes to debate this issue? Seeing none, we will proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 341. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
