LB 498, 703, 703A

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Pirsch. Does anyone else wish to debate this motion? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Schellpeper? Closing is waived. We'll proceed to the motion to advance LB 703. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the advancement of 703, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 703 is advanced. LB 703A.

CLERK: LB 703A, by Senator Wesely. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, thank you, Madam Chair. This, as I explained before, is actually \$5,100 of state funds. Now it shows about \$28,000 some dollars, but that's federal, cash and general, but it's really \$5,100 of our General Funds and this is for the federal mandate for child support. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Seeing no one wishing to debate this motion, proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 703A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.
