LB 67

SENATOR MORRISSEY: I would accept call in votes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Call in votes will be accepted. Please record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All members who are not excused please return to the Chamber and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Please check in. Senator Landis and Hefner, would you please check in? Senator Pirsch. We are looking for Speaker Baack, Senator Moore, Senator Kristensen, Senator Warner, Senator Schmit. We are accepting call in votes on the motion to cease debate.

CLERK: Senator Hefner voting yes. Senator Crosby changing from yes to no. Senator Ashford voting no.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: I request a roll call vote so we can get moving here.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: We will proceed with a roll call vote on the motion to call the question.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 888 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 12 nays to cease debate.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We will not cease debate. We will continue to debate the question which is to indefinitely postpone LB 67. I will raise the call. Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: Madam President, I, too, will be voting against indefinitely postponing LB 67. I related to you the other day my experience particularly in the Town of Doniphan but I don't see it any different than any other town. If we do not eventually come up with some rules, some regulations, tell those people what they need to do, and so on, it will be this bitterness that we see in front of us. It will pit community against community, neighbor against neighbor, and they, too, have to have some direction. A good share of those people that
