SENATOR SCHMIT: ...I really believe, and I said it jokingly the other day, but I really believe if I want to pass a bill on this floor, I have got to come in with the reverse of whatever they want to get it done. Had I come in and said we are going to continue the Whitney amendment for another 10 years, Senator Morrissey would have come charging out in all directions, along with a whole bunch of other people and said Schmit is delaying and he is obfuscating the problem, and so forth. Well, ladies and gentlemen, if you do not kill 67, then you ought not to leave the Morrissey amendment in there. And you take a look at what Senator Johnson wants to do and you are stretching it out another four years,...
