LB 16, 298, 328, 350, 363A, 419, 465A

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, members, the A bill allows for the rewrite of the rules and regulations that would be required under the provisions of 363A which again allows for greater generic substitution of drugs. That is a one-time expenditure to rewrite the rules and regs. It would be paid for out of cash funds. There wouldn't be any General Fund money involved. I'd move for the advancement of the A bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any discussion on the advancement of 363A? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Wesely? He waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 363A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Voting on the advancement of 363A, have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 363A.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 363A advances. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, thank you. Your Committee on Retirement reports LB 350 to General File. That is signed by Senator Nelson as Chair. Business and Labor reports LB 328 to General File, LB 298 to General File with amendments attached, and LB 16 indefinitely postponed, those signed by Senator Coordsen as Chair. A notice of hearing from Business and Labor, signed by Senator Coordsen. And a new A bill, LB 465A, by Senator Landis. (Read for the first time by title. See pages 893-94 of the Legislative Journal.)
