

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. We'll now proceed to vote on the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 336. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the committee amendments. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Committee amendments are adopted. Before we proceed, I would like to call the attention of the senators to the area under the south balcony. A special guest of the Legislature today is a former State Senator, former Speaker, and former Lieutenant Governor of the State of Nebraska, Lieutenant Governor William Nichol and his wife, Ruth. Welcome to the Chambers today. Thank you. Do you have an amendment on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Kristensen would move to amend. Senator, your amendment is on page 689 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President. Members of the Legislature, this amendment is one that is generated from myself and not through the committee amendments, and was as a result also of listening in committee and talking to a wide variety of people. One of the problems with this bill, I think, is that it's very difficult to do what Senator Nelson and Senator Moore were discussing, and that is to tell people that they're going to have to spend some money on a driver education course. But, at the same time, this bill also addresses what happens to people, and you'll see this on page 4 of the actual bill. So, if you look at the bill, it says, whenever it comes to the attention of the director, that of Motor Vehicles, that any person who has not attained the age of 18, they've been convicted of three moving violations, or have accumulated a total of 6 or more points, as set out, and then 669 is the rules of the road, or been involved in at least two accidents required to be reported, within a year, then you have to take sort of a reinstatement course. What this is, is to identify young drivers who, once they have their license, have picked up three moving violations, lost six points, that's how we quickly identify, and most people will tell you that's how you find the
