

you have closing, Senator Kristensen?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President. Just to review with you real quickly what the amendment does. It takes out the requirement that if you've had at least two accidents, that need to be reported, during a year, that those are taken out of the bill, primarily because there was no way to allocate fault and you might have been an innocent victim of two accidents, and you shouldn't have to take a driver refreshing course, or another driver training course because of that. With that, I would urge the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. We'll now vote on the Kristensen amendment to LB 336. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Madam President. Members of the Legislature, in my district we have a local county sheriff who has been reading the school driver's permit section of this law extremely strictly. In the school driver's permit section, which appears on page 15 of the green copy of the bill, it states, "A school permit shall be used for the sole purpose of transporting a person or family member, who resides with that person, to attend school." And they're interpreting that to mean he can drive only to school to attend class, and he cannot drive for a school sponsored activity, such as a band practice that meets before school, or a drama practice for a school play that meets after school or in the evening. And my amendment would clarify to this extent, it would say they could drive to school or a school sponsored activity held on the premises where
