SENATOR SCHIMEK: I don't think we should wait around this time, let's just have a call of the house, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a motion for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All unexcused senators please return to their seats and check in. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Please check in. We're looking for Senators Abboud, Chizek, Hall, Hefner, Labeledz, Senators Lynch and Moore. Senator Schrock, Senator Smith, Senator Warner. Senator Schimek said she will take call in votes too.

CLERK: Senator Hall voting yes, Senator Labeledz voting yes, Senator Chizek voting yes, Senator Nelson voting yes, Senator Robak voting yes, Senator Lindsay voting yes, Senator Lynch voting yes, Senator Beutler voting yes, Senator Horgan voting yes, Senator Coordsen voting yes, Senator Conway voting yes, Senator Elmer voting yes, Senator Rod Johnson voting yes, Senator Wehrbein voting yes, Senator Hartnett...

PRESIDENT MOUL: Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 6 nays on the advancement of LB 85.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 85 is advanced. I will raise the call. LB 85A.

CLERK: Madam President, 85A was a bill introduced by Senator Schimek. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Madam President, thank you. Members of the body, the fiscal note on this is \$17,763, as I mentioned earlier, for the year '91-92. There is no expenditure for '92-93. And, as I said to you earlier when discussing the bill, I want to see how this works myself. For me, this is really a one-year commitment although there is no sunset on the bill.
