CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would move to amend his A bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wesely, on the amendment.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The amendment was brought to me by the fiscal office. It deals with personal expenditure limits that are in the bill. I don't have it in front of me but it's...evidently the wrong figure was used. It doesn't change the overall figure. It's just a certain personal care limit was inaccurately placed in the bill, so this would correct that. I move the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there anyone who wishes to discuss the amendment? If not, Senator Wesely, do you wish to close? We will proceed to vote on the amendment offered by Senator Wesely. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. We will now go to the bill as amended. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members, I appreciate very much your advancement of the bill, would appreciate your advancement of this A bill. Again, I want to emphasize, we understand the budget constraints we have. A strong showing of support of the legislation indicates you understand the positive impact of the legislation and we'll see once we get the opportunity what's affordable and we can make adjustments in this bill and the A bill. We will be glad to do that but it is important to advance the A bill. Move for its advancement.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any discussion on the advancement of the A bill? Senator Wesely, do you wish to close? Waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 433A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We're voting on the advancement of LB 433A. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
