There are some community colleges that do the driver's ed training and they wanted that changed in there so it's just driver training instructors. They will still all be certified by the Department of Education. If there is any questions, I'd be glad to answer them. If not, I would just move the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Speaker Baack. Is there anyone who wishes to speak on this bill? Seeing none, do you have closing? Closing is waived. We will proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 44. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 44.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 44 is advanced. LB 333.

CLERK: LB 333 introduced by Senator Morrissey and Baack. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 16, referred to Transportation, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Madam President and members. LB 333 simply would allow people to change their tax status. In other words, if they move out of state they would be allowed a prorated refund on their licenses, same as instate people are allowed if they get rid of their cars now. Pretty simple. Current law provides that prorated refunds for registration and property taxes can be applied for within 60 days of the date that the ownership of the motor vehicle is transferred or the date of a legislative act or court decision which disallows the use of a motor vehicle on public roads. Registration fees may also be refunded if application is made within 60 days of the date that possess'ion of the vehicle is lost to the date when a salvage certificate is issued. LB 333 would require that upon application for a refund, evidence that the motor vehicle had been registered in another state would have been provided. I'd urge your support. Thank you.
