representatives from the Social Ministry Commission of the Archdiocese of Omaha, and they are in the south balcony. Would you please stand and be welcomed by your Legislature. Thank you for being with us. Proceed to LB 500, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 500, introduced by Senators Schrock, Nelson, Lamb, and Elmer. (Read title.) Introduced on January 22, referred to Natural Resources, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Speaker, members of the legislative body, LB 500 conveys a tract of land from the Game and Parks Commission to the Nebraska Department of Roads. The Nebraska Department of Roads will then give the tract of land to the City of Lexington, it will be used for the Heartland Museum, which is a military museum made up of a group of volunteers who now have restored at least 20 military vehicles, including several tract vehicles. It's a nice piece of legislation because the Game and Parks Commission is in favor of it, the Department of Roads is in favor of it, the City of Lexington is in favor of it, and there was no opposition. And I would move the advancement of this bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Is there any discussion on the advancement of LB 500? Seeing none, Senator Schrock, do you wish to close? He waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 500. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 500.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 500 advances. We'll now proceed to...LB 697 was removed from the agenda by three members of the Legislature. So we'll move to LB 716.

CLERK: LB 716, Mr. President, introduced by Senators Rod Johnson and Elmer. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 23, referred to Natural Resources. The bill was advanced to General File. Senator, you want your amendment now, or explain your bill first?
